

Performance Management Guide

This Guide covers the standards and methods expected by the council for the duration of the contract. It is for guidance of how all of council assets and groundworks should be completed and maintained.

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1. Overall Purpose

Haddenham Parish Council owns or has responsibility for the grounds maintenance of a number of diverse areas. These include areas which are used for sport and recreation, nature reserve, residential areas and highway verges. It is important that Contractors can demonstrate the skills required to maintain the different needs of each area and ensure it remains clean, tidy and well-maintained and reflects the Councils Performance Management Guide grading criteria and adheres to good horticultural and environmental practice.

All work shall consequently be carried out and project managed appropriately so as to leave the whole of each site in a well maintained and tidy condition at all times.

The purpose of this Guide is to generally define the standard to be achieved, rather than define the precise method by which the Contractor will be required to perform the service. In some situations, however a more detailed specification is provided.

Each area when completed is expected to be left at standard A and to not fall below standard B before the next visit.

2. Standard Specification

General Amenity and Verges

All grass shall be cut cleanly to the specified height on each site, without damaging the existing surface. Where the height of cut is defined, it is the height above ground level to the cutting blade, measured with the machine standing on a flat surface. Scraper bars to front rollers, where fitted, must be finely adjusted to keep rollers free from accretions of mud, etc. When machines do not have scraper bars, front rollers must be frequently cleaned. Ensure that area of brambles and other vegetation is cut back and does not encroach ono the grass areas.

Sports Pitches

The grass shall be maintained at a height of 30-45 mm using cylinder/rotary mowing equipment. The grass should never be allowed to exceed a height of 45 mm. If the grass does become too long, the height of cut should be reduced gradually over 3-4 cuts allowing some time for recovery in between. N.B. On no account, should the grass height be reduced by more than 50% on any one occasion. Overall, approximately 30 mowing operations may be required each year, depending on weather and growing conditions

Frequent mowing will encourage a thickening of the sward and is very beneficial. During the growing season pitches should be mown a minimum of once a week, with once a fortnight being sufficient at other times. Mowing is unlikely to be required over winter. If mowing is carried out at the correct frequency, clippings can be returned to the sward with no ill effect, more pertinently following fertilising. Please note: Excessive grass clippings are a significant contributing factor to thatch accumulation, if thatch is becoming increasingly prevalent, grass clipping should be collected during mowing.
