VALP UPDATE: NEW SETTLEMENT POSTPONED — FOR NOW

AVDC have published the latest draft of the Vale of Aylesbury Local Plan (VALP) for a final round of consultation before the Plan is sent to the Government's planning inspector for examination in public (EIP) early in 2018. VALP sets out development and land use proposals for the period 2013-2033, so is already late. VALP includes the assessment of population, housing and employment needs not only within the District, but also overspill needs from neighbouring Districts as required under the "duty to cooperate".

What does the latest draft say?

- The overall number of new homes to be built across the Vale in the period 2013-2033 is 28,830 (down from 33,000 in the 2016 consultation). The new figure includes 8,000 homes to help Chiltern, South Bucks and Wycombe District Councils under the duty to cooperate.
- 75% of new homes will be in the 5 strategic settlements, with 1,050 in Haddenham on the 3 sites above, plus smaller developments at Dollicott and Stanbridge Rd (about half of the total Vale-wide need has already translated into site approvals).
- The new settlement proposal of 4,500 homes in or near Haddenham is no longer in the Plan. BUT AVDC says it
 expects a new settlement to form part of an early review of the Plan, which could be as soon as 2 years
 after adoption.

The story so far: 2014

- 1st version of Plan thrown out by EIP inspector, mainly for insufficient housing growth and failing on "duty to cooperate".
- This draft had 100 new homes in Haddenham.
- AVDC returns to the drawing board and re-starts entire process.

2015

- "Issues & Options" consultation stage shows Haddenham as a "strategic settlement" (along with Aylesbury, Buckingham, Wendover and Winslow) getting 50% growth of about 1000 homes.
- The Parish Council (PC) submitted detailed objection to strategic settlement status.

VALP UPDATE: NEW SETTLEMENT POSTPONED - FOR NOW

2016


- Draft issued for public consultation still shows Haddenham as a "strategic settlement" with 1050 new homes (mostly on 3 large sites Aston Rd, Airfield, Churchway) AND is first choice for a new settlement of at least 4,500 homes, with more in later years.
- The PC organised a public meeting attended by 200 villagers, distributed two newsletters to all households, and submitted a detailed 9 page response.
- Outline planning permission granted for both Airfield and Aston Rd sites (the latter following public inquiry defended by the PC).
- Neighbourhood Plan's housing chapter quashed at judicial review brought by hostile developer and not defended by AVDC.

2017

• Final draft issued prior to EIP in 2018, followed by any modification and formal adoption in late 2018.

Why is early review likely?

- Government is proposing a new national method of calculating housing need which in Aylesbury Vale could mean a 55% uplift to the current figure.
- Government is proposing a new delivery test to ensure Councils and developers actually deliver on site.




What is the current consultation about?

- The Plan is open for public comment from 2nd November to 14th December
- At this stage, comments should focus only on soundness and legal compliance (ie that due process has been followed)
- Comments will be collated and passed directly to the EIP inspector (rather than used to modify the draft Plan)
- There is an on-line portal and process for making comments with guidance

Do you Walk or Cycle?

Haddenham Safe Walking & Cycling Group has been working hard on your behalf in 2017 to improve conditions on our country footpaths and to provide cycleways which can be used by wheelchairs, buggies, young children and pedestrians.


WALKING: We have replaced 5 stiles with kissing gates on the footpath to Chearsley from the airfield. One farmer has spurned our offer of a free gate to replace his stile on the A418. The stile has now gone but instead he has wired up an old farm gate which requires athletic prowess to scale. BCC have requested him to put in a new stile. On the path to Thame via Kingsey, another daunting gate has been replaced by a **special field gate**, which can be locked closed, but has a self-latching pedestrian gate embedded within it. It proved very difficult to install but all problems were overcome by Bill Piers who had to get a bespoke galvanised spacer/adapter. This gate has been paid for by donation from the Ramblers, OCC, the Clark family and Andrew Gordon.

Lands Improvement have paid for more signs on the permissive path on the airfield and David Eining Contracting, of Thame, have generously given more than £600 for new signs for all the footpaths between Haddenham and Thame. Delivery expected soon. We are trying to complete the Round Haddenham Circular Walk and only 400m is now missing. Jim Robinson has taken over from Peter Gulland as our local 'path checker'. He keeps an eye on damaged gates & stiles which stop us using the footpaths, ploughed up paths and any other path problems in the area around Haddenham. He needs your help. If you discover a problem, first, take a photo of it and then click on:

http://transportforbucks.net/report-it-prow.aspx. (The online system makes it easy for you to identify the path number; it appears automatically when you click on the site of your discovery.) Then you can upload your photo. Credit is due to Jim, Brian Bowman and Bill Piers in particular, for their work on walking

improvements.

CYCLING: the procedure to get the Cycleway to Thame is moving at its usual glacial pace. Both OCC & BCC have together funded Sustrans to contact all landowners on the potential route via Thame Road and the A418. Only after this is completed, (perhaps by Christmas) can the route be planned in detail, yet another feasibility study be done by Transport for Bucks (expensive) and official consultations begin. Community Orchard



The Community Orchard was officially opened on Saturday 21st October. You may not be aware that the area was the residue of the Farrar Bell field which was given

to the Parish Council by Rectory Homes when a planning application for it to be used for additional properties was refused. A consensus amongst the villagers in 2014 came down in favour of the area to be used as a community orchard.

The layout was based on old varieties of fruit ripening early-to-late over an extended period, so that the fruit can be enjoyed over several months of the year. In addition, the fruit trees planted in columns were designed to be self-pollinating.

Bringing this project to fruition (!) has required the hard work of a number of people, whose contributions were noted on the day, and including our own Parish Clerk, Sue Gilbert. We hope that residents of Haddenham, young and old will enjoy this delightful new facility (and its output in due course!).

Following the very successful lecture last year on Haddenham Birdlife it was decided to have a lecture on the wild flowers which are prominent in this area of the county. There will also be a guided walk later in the year to locate and identify interesting wild flowers in the village surroundings. Children welcome.

Haddenham Wassail

The time around 12th night (after Christmas) is when our fruit trees and gardens are at their most barren and stores of last year's harvest are getting used up. This is when we look forward to the spring, new life and fresh food from our gardens. This is also a time when enlightened spirits go wassailing* to honour our fruit trees and more generally our bountiful soil that provides food and shelter.

The Haddenham Wassail party will be meeting on Saturday 6 January at 4.30pm outside the bakery in Fort End and will process up Baker's Alley to the community orchard off Townsend Green. We will visit a few trees** around the orchard, call the traditional chant, make a bit of noise to scare off the evil spirits, put some toast in the branches of the trees (for the wrens of course!), sprinkle a little cider around their roots (and maybe drink a little!) and hope that 2018 gives a good a crop as 2017 (we've been overrun by apples in Haddenham: we must have wassailed well last January!)

If you are coming, bring suitable footwear, warm clothes, a torch (it will be getting dark when we finish), something to make a noise (shotguns are traditional but two pieces of wood that clack together are more practical – and less risky!). It was rumoured that someone might bring some wassail cake.....? Next autumn you will be proud to think of your contribution to a great harvest of fruit in cold dark January!

- * Wassail derives from the old norse greeting 'Waes Hail!' meaning 'Be of Good Health' to which the traditional response is 'Drinc Hail!'
- **Contrary to some misconceptions, it is not necessary to wassail each tree as they are linked underground by mitochondrial threads which pass nutrients, and the wassail spirit, between each other

Christmas starts here!

For the thirsty there will be 40 real ales on offer, all from micro breweries within 35 miles of Haddenham, as well as a dozen ciders, wine *(mulled and unmulled)*, phenomenal gins and plenty of other offerings to suit all tastes.

Artisan food stalls will satisfy the munchies as you are entertained by 5 local bands and, of course, the Haddenham Mummers will treat you to a masterclass in thespianism!

As many of you will already know, the Winterfest has a fun, party atmosphere - enjoyment is obligatory. Winterfest is run by Haddenham Beer Festival Trust, a charity who distribute income from both summer and winter festivals to help support local groups and organisations. To date over £240,000 has been raised and distributed.

The Haddenham Mummers

The Haddenham Mummers will be back on tour this Christmas with several dates during December. Having raised over £3,000 for local causes and the MPS charity this tightly drilled squad of highly skilled actors will be performing the traditional Haddenham Mummers play in the village and elsewhere, thrilling audiences new and old.

The mummers play, a traditional tale of good versus evil was first written down in the 1930s by Walter Rose, a famous son of the village, author and skilled carpenter. As well as his name living on in the village hall meeting room, he also appears in the mummers play, measuring up a corpse for a coffin. Over the years the Haddenham Mummers have collected more than £30,000 and been sponsored by Chiltern Railways.

This year performances include the Winterfest on Saturday 9th December, the village carol service on Friday 15th December and the 'In Village Tour' on Friday 22nd December. See Haddenham.net and posters around the village and in the library for further details closer to the time!

Haddenham Parochial Charities grants

The trustees of the Haddenham Parochial Charities are now inviting applications from the less fortunate residents of the parish for gifts from the Joseph Franklin, the Rev. John Willis and the Alms Corn charities.

The objects of the original bequests were to provide bread and coal for the poor at Christmas, and seed corn on Good Friday for the poor who did not otherwise receive alms. Nowadays the trustees make small gifts of money to eligible Haddenham residents by dividing the charities' annual income. The list of claimants is kept confidential.

Road Works Ahead

There will be severe disruption in the Station Road/Church End area of Haddenham, starting on 17th November and potentially lasting until the end of January 2018.

Thames Water is undertaking significant works which are Improving our water pipes, substituting new larger, stronger plastic pipes for the old ones.

The first phase of work is to result in the closure of sections of Station Road between Townside and Gibson Lane, from November 17th to December 22nd. Thames Water advise that between Saturday December 23rd and Monday January 1st "all traffic management will be removed". The road will then be closed in Church End between the War Memorial and the footpath to the lychgate from January 2nd to 26th. Traffic lights will be in operation at times at various locations in Station Road/Church End between the bottom of Townside and the footpath up to the lychgate.

In addition, work is planned in the New Year which will affect Thame Road from the area of the station to the A418, with diversions likely to include Pegasus Way for journeys to Thame, and other village roads for journeys to Aylesbury.

Additionally, it is understood that resurfacing works are planned for Aston Road in the New Year.

In short, allow extra time for your journeys over the next few months and please take care whether you are driving, cycling or walking, as many of our village roads are likely to be even busier than usual.

Could you spare some time to help run our Youth & Community Centre?

The Haddenham Youth & Community Centre is run by a small group of volunteer trustees who took over from Bucks County Council a few years ago. We need new trustees to safeguard the Centre's future, and would love to hear from anyone prepared to give a few hours a week, whether supporting the weekly youth club, managing bookings, or sorting out occasional repairs, as well as contributing to quarterly trustee meetings.
