Banks Park Playground

The old playground at Banks Park was very limited with very little play value. The Parish Council was delighted to install a brand new playground, with lots of exciting new equipment for designed for children under twelve. The feedback has been really positive and we were pleased to incorporate an inclusive roundabout and as well as other elements allowing participation for all.



Sheerstock Playground

This playground only had two old swings and a slide. We are delighted provide a whole new facility. With swings, trampoline matt, ball wall, table tennis table, multiplay units to name but a few of the exciting play equipment now installed. This recreation area is for all ages, with the playground area suitable for U14 and a new sports area for any age.
