II change in local governmen

Two proposals have been submitted to the Secretary of State for Communities and Local Government, Sajid Javid, to change the system of local government in Buckinghamshire:

- Buckinghamshire County Council has submitted a proposal after carrying out an in-house review; and
- The four District Councils in Buckinghamshire (Aylesbury Vale, Wycombe, Chiltern and South Bucks) have commissioned Deloitte to undertake their own independent review and have also submitted a proposal.

What system do we currently use?

Local government in Buckinghamshire currently operates under a two-tier system – Bucks County Council and the four district councils - each tier having responsibility for different services. Milton Keynes, to the north of the county, is already run as a unitary authority (i.e. they are responsible for all services).

What are the proposals?

Both proposals would remove the existing County and District councils.

Bucks County Council proposes replacing them with a single new unitary authority for the whole county.

The four District Councils recommend replacing them with two new unitary authorities:

- one located in northern Buckinghamshire, covering the existing area of AVDC; and
- one in southern Buckinghamshire, covering the area of the three southern District Councils.

Each unitary authority would deliver all council services.

What about parish councils?

Parish and town councils will keep their existing responsibilities, and will need to forge a new relationship with their unitary authority. Bucks County Council proposes establishing 19 community boards for local decision-making with devolved budgets, which would include Parish Council representatives. Additionally, devolved services may be offered to parishes wishing to manage some services more locally. The District Councils' offer to parishes refers only to the creation of eight area panels, "meeting when required".



Why is this happening?

Both County and District councils agree that the current system has to change:

- although demands on public services have been increasing, government funding has been reducing and will soon be zero, leaving a large funding gap to be addressed; and
- changing to a unitary system will deliver significant cost savings and transform how local services are funded and managed.

A decision is expected by government before the end of this financial year in March.

Parking Restrictions: an update!

In our November issue we reported that Transport for Buckinghamshire ('TfB') held an opinion survey about the introduction of parking restrictions on roads near Haddenham & Thame Parkway. Following an excellent response, TfB reported they would recommend breaking the project into two phases. The officer's report is available on the Haddenham Parish Council website.

Phase One addresses the urgent need to introduce parking restrictions on Thame Road, identified as a major safety issue. As no residential properties front onto this stretch of Thame Road, further consultation is not needed, so an experimental traffic regulation order ('TRO') can be made.

During January plans have been prepared to introduce:

- a new clearway from Station Road to the entrance to the station;
- double yellow lines from the station to the Wykeham Way junction; and
- an extension of the Pegasus Way clearway up to the A418.

The TRO will be advertised in the local press in compliance with legal requirements. Although we anticipate the yellow lines will be painted within a few weeks, there are - as ever - pressures from competing projects that cause delays; however, Haddenham is considered high priority.

Phase Two entails preparing a detailed design to introduce parking restrictions on residential roads. This will be followed by a further round of consultation with those residents directly affected, then by an additional TRO. Phase Two will take place in the new financial year when Chiltern Railways have agreed to contribute towards the cost.

Bus Bays: Still in Use!

We would like to remind residents that it is illegal to park in bus bays.

The Clerk has received reports that vehicles are being parked in bus bays on Churchway, especially the one opposite the Post Office.

Although many residents think these stops are no longer used since the 280 bus was re-routed, school buses drop off and pick up from these bus stops, which are clearly designated bus bays.

Parking in these spaces is of concern at any time of the year, but during the winter months it can be particularly hazardous for the school children, who board and alight in the dark.

It is an offence to park a private or commercial vehicle in a designated bus bay.

Dementia: Raising awareness!

What is Dementia Friends?

Alzheimer's Society's Dementia Friends programme is their biggest initiative to change people's perceptions of dementia.

It was launched to tackle the stigma and insensitivity surrounding dementia, resulting in sufferers experiencing loneliness and social exclusion. There is a growing need to create more dementia-friendly communities and businesses so those affected feel included and understood.

The popular museum – in the old schoolroom behind the Methodist Church in the High Street – reflects how the village has transformed. Last autumn a new DVD, The Changing Face of Haddenham, produced by ex-BBC Mike Stephens quickly sold out and extra copies are now



available to buy. Shot in 2016, this gives everyone (including relatives, house buyers and overseas friends!) a current picture of Haddenham.

The museum now has a range of notecards including paintings and drawings by Haddenham artists and two village maps. Up-to-date street maps are also on sale. Parish Council to provide new burial space in the village

With the closure of St Mary's churchyard, the Parish Council is to provide new burial space in the village. Consisting of 1.02 Ha on the Glebe site – as specified in the Haddenham Neighbourhood Plan – the Diocese and other landowners have been working together to sell the land on to a developer since its outline planning application was approved in June 2016.

After we are introduced to the developer, discussions can be held on the detailed plans to deliver the burial ground, the sports facility and the country park, all of which will be handed over to us.

We have budgeted over five years, beginning last year, to fund the Neighbourhood Plan project to provide the burial ground. We will shortly establish a new Burial Ground Working Group to manage this project, which will include representatives of the Parish Council, the Church and neighbouring residents.

Concerns about the likely closure of St. Mary's churchyard were raised several years ago and we were approached about providing new burial space in the village. At the time we did not own any suitable land and the associated costs were considered beyond reach.

However, the recent growth of Haddenham has given the land opportunity for providing a new burial ground, and we are busy researching the feasibility of taking on the role of being a burial authority. Visits are being made to other parishes which have done this.

Closure of St Mary's Haddenham churchyard



St Mary's churchyard is formally closing. Many residents are aware that the churchyard has been running out of space and St Mary's has been in close contact with the Parish Council for some years on this matter. This means no further burials can take place in new graves, nor burials of ashes in new or existing plots in the churchyard.

However, there is an exception for existing double depth graves with space remaining to be used. We have also been given a special concession to enable the children's burial area to remain available, while space permits. For more detailed information please visit: www.haddenhamstmarys.org

St Mary's will continue to support families during bereavement. A person does not need to have been a regular churchgoer for relatives to ask for one of the clergy team to support them through bereavement and a funeral. The team will continue to provide funerals in the church and at the crematorium, and are available to officiate at burials in civic cemeteries.

To mark the closure of the churchyard we are having a special afternoon on Sunday 23 April 2017. It will begin at 3.00pm with a tour of the churchyard; at 3.30pm we will have a service in the church to mark the closure and to have space for personal remembrance. We will end at 4.00pm with refreshments. All are welcome.

Register to Vote: Choose your Bucks County Councillors!

Local government elections take place on 4th May 2017, with the deadline to register to vote Thursday 13th April. As Buckinghamshire is considering changing to a unitary authority system, these elections are for two years rather than the standard four.

The Annual Plan and Precept setting

At the end of 2016 the Parish Council agreed its annual plan and set the budgets for the 2017-18 financial year to make its precept request to AVDC in January. Increases in the previous two years means the budget is at a level where additional responsibilities and some ageing parish assets can be properly managed.

The 2017-18 precept will increase slightly by 1.5%, bringing it to £314,840. Consequently, the Parish Council portion of Council Tax for a Band D home will be £138 for the year (an increase of £1.87). Below are some of the our plans for the coming year. The Parish Council website has full details of the Annual Plan, including a detailed breakdown of the budgets used to set the precept.

Village maintenance

Following the departure of the village handyman at the end of 2016, we are reviewing village maintenance. Several options are being assessed. Providing a good customer service will be the priority and allowance for a budget increase has been included.

Parking

We are working with Buckinghamshire County Council and Chiltern Railways to resolve problems caused parking on the Thame Road. Some flexibility in the current year's budget means we can contribute towards the cost of a feasibility study and urgent restrictions needed on the Thame Road. As this will continue beyond April 2017, there may be calls on our finances to ensure that restrictions on residential roads progress.

Trees and streetlights

As the need to maintain and/or replace ageing streetlights (those aged 30-40 years) and trees in many areas of Haddenham has increased, we have set aside reserves and increased budgets. Many streetlights are being converted to LED – an additional expense in the short-term – which will result in longer-term savings.

New development means new facilities, but we need help

The budget allows us to seek professional help with the detailed planning applications for the Airfield and Aston Road sites. As part of these developments we will be responsible for new recreational facilities, including football pitches, cricket pitches, play areas and parkland. We are negotiating with the developers and – following design advice – we have already succeeded in improving the Airfield site. We have also included the cost of a new burial ground for the village over the next 3-4 years. There will also be an on-going need for planning, design and project management to deliver these new facilities.

Devolved services

In 2015 we took on responsibility from the county council for cutting grass verges. We have since been improving this service by increasing the number of cuts from 6 to 10 per year. With budget cuts and a potential move to a unitary authority, it is likely that additional service responsibilities will be offered to parishes. Therefore we have included a devolved services budget as a new reserve in preparation and to pay for ad-hoc projects, where restricted county council budgets reduce the ability to achieve.

Where have we saved money?

This year allotment plot holders group volunteers began a project to install a borehole on the allotment site. The Parish Council prime funded this to allow work to start, and subsequent fundraising has made a significant contribution towards the cost. The borehole should be operational in the spring, saving around £1,500 a year in water charges.

The 2016/17 budget included £20,000 to update the Neighbourhood Plan. However, we realised when the draft Vale of Aylesbury Local Plan ('VALP') was published that it would not be worth spending this money until plans for Haddenham became more certain. Therefore we have allocated this money to a reserve for 2017-18, reducing the budget to £5,000. This will provide the £25,000 needed to update the Neighbourhood Plan once the VALP details are known or to use for representation at the public inquiry for the VALP if it is thought necessary.

FOCUS ON: Your Parish Council

What is a Parish Council?

- An elected body in the first tier of government
- Legally granted powers by Parliament to raise money through taxation ("a precept") and a range of powers to spend public money

What do Parish Councillors do?

- Unpaid, elected representatives who work together to serve the community
- Bring issues to the attention of the council, and make decisions on behalf of the local community

What does your Parish Council do?

Responsibilities include: commenting on planning applications and future plans; Neighbourhood Plans; providing traffic signs and other notices; providing burial grounds and maintaining the churchyard; allotments; bus shelters; residential street lighting; maintaining verges and footpaths; litter; recreation grounds; ponds; public seats (e.g. benches); war memorials; trustee of two charities.

What happens next?

A Community Practice Worker will contact you to arrange a time to come and talk to you about your interests, what you would like to achieve, and work with you to consider local available services that may be appropriate. The Community Practice Worker can contact the activities and services you might be interested in attending or receiving in your home, and can support you until you feel confident and happy to be independent.

Case study: How Prevention Matters helped Georgina:

After the death of her last remaining family member Georgina was concerned about her declining health and money worries. A Prevention Matters Community Practice Worker visited her at home to see how we could help.

The Community Practice Worker helped organise a home visit to assess her property for disability allowance, arranged taxi tokens so Georgina could attend appointments, and ordered home shopping and meal delivery catalogues so she wasn't reliant on friends.

Georgina now feels better informed about the services available to her and through Prevention Matters is now £200 a month better off, feels safer at home and is less worried about her finances.

Haddenham planning update: the latest!

With the government's much-anticipated Housing White Paper expected this month, the timetable for the final Vale of Aylesbury Local Plan ('VALP') draft has been extended. The White Paper could affect the



VALP, as a new method of calculating housing need may be imposed on councils, potentially affecting how five-year housing land supply is calculated. Although Vale-wide target housing numbers have been lowered since the summer from 32,000 to 27,000, potentially reducing the need for a new settlement, our housing requirement may rise again. The Parish Council will circulate more details when known.

AVDC is also facing pressures elsewhere. The government agency advising on long-term infrastructure challenges – National Infrastructure Commission ('NIC') – advocates major growth in Aylesbury Vale, including Haddenham and Winslow. The government announced in its 2016 Autumn Statement that it would fund the NIC's proposals for an Oxford-Cambridge railway and expressway, with one option for the expressway's western section essentially following the A418 from Oxford to Aylesbury. The Parish Council and the Village Society have raised the absence of local level consultation by the NIC with our MP. Meanwhile, the government has agreed to designate Aylesbury a 'garden town', which will mean additional infrastructure resources.

Finally, the Parish Council have been following up Neighbourhood Plan commitments, and responding to various site proposals arising from Haddenham's position as a strategic settlement. This includes agreeing with village clubs and groups how developers' contributions should be utilised for sports and recreation. Planning applications currently in or expected include:

- Airfield industrial site: DAF are transferring their UK headquarters and national training facility from Thame;
- Airfield housing site: As we are obtaining a new sports facility and receiving a dowry towards a pavilion, we have specified requirements for football pitches and commissioned initial work on the pavilion;
- Stanbridge Road site: We have requested the footpath be extended to the garden centre, and the 30 mph limit be moved southwards;
- Aston Road site: As we understand the developer will shortly approach us, we have commissioned designers to formulate a brief for a new burial ground, cricket pitch and suitable multi-purpose building.




