



A New Zebra Crossing for Woodways

In the first week of June it is anticipated that work will finally begin on the installation of a zebra crossing on Woodways. The road will be closed for 3-4 days during this week for the work to be carried out. The scheme will involve improvements to street lighting with new columns being added which light the crossing and include belisha beacons. The footway will be widened and the bus stop by the tennis courts will be relocated on a new base towards the entrance to the playing fields. The traffic calming



build-out will be removed and replaced with new speed cushions. A new pedestrian entrance into the playing field car park will be created so vehicles and pedestrian will be separated.

The campaign for a zebra crossing on Woodways started in 2011 and has been led by Emma Lister a parent from the Junior School and supported by the Safe Walking and Cycling Group and the schools on Woodways. In 2012-13 the Parish Council successfully applied for funding from the Local Area Forum for a feasibility study that identified the need for improvements to road safety on Woodways and recommended the installation of a zebra crossing. The cost of the proposal was estimated to be £86,000 which then needed to be raised. In 2014 the Parish Council successfully applied to Aylesbury Vale District Council (AVDC) to fund the full cost of the scheme through the New Homes Bonus Scheme. The New Homes Bonus is a fund paid to local authorities based on the increase in council tax raised from the building of new homes and AVDC makes some of this funding available to parishes through grant applications based on the number of new homes with planning permission in the parish.

Since obtaining approval for funding the campaign group and the Parish Council have been working with Transport for Buckinghamshire (TfB) to deliver the scheme within the budget. This has taken longer than anticipated due to other higher priority projects at TfB and an extension to the deadline to spend the NHB grant was obtained to the end of June 2016. In January work began in earnest to finalise the details of the proposal through a series of meetings. In April the finalised scheme was launched for a formal public consultation which ended with no objections being raised, therefore commissioning of the contractors to carry out the work has now begun.

The Parish Council would like to thank everybody involved in making this improvement to road safety in the village possible.

Planning Update

The March Village News advised that the housing chapter 6 of the Neighbourhood Plan (NP) had been quashed in Court following judicial review. What's happened since?

We had the opportunity to make further representation to the Secretary of State of the Department for Communities & Local Government, who is due to determine the Aston Road planning application further to last November's public inquiry. We have made the case that despite the quashing of chapter 6, underpinning the NP was a spatial strategy supported by 86% of voters at last summer's referendum, and also that various site-specific objections remain unresolved. A decision is expected soon.

AVDC's draft of its much delayed Vale of Aylesbury Local Plan is now due to be published on 2nd June for public consultation. Expect Haddenham to be designated a "strategic settlement" in line to take approaching 1000 new homes in the period 2013 to 2033 (including all permissions approved after April 2013 to date) as its contribution to Vale-wide housing need of at least 31,000 homes. This will bring to an end the period of static population growth between the 1981 and 2011 census years. Some will see this as a threat; others as an opportunity for more services, particularly leisure and recreation. In order to shape this growth, the Parish Council (along with many Parish and Town Councils elsewhere) wishes to review and update its Neighbourhood Plan. Anyone interested in taking part in this review is invited to contact the Parish Clerk, Sue Gilbert, to find out more.

Meanwhile 5 significant planning applications have been submitted to AVDC for decision in the last few months. Further details are shown below. The first 3 applications are all sites which were included in the Neighbourhood Plan, and so are being supported in principle by the Parish Council. The 4th application, on the airfield business park, has just been received, so not vet formally considered by the PC. This is a reserved matters (i.e. detailed) application following in-principle approval in 2015, on a site also included in the NP. The 5th application, by Sainsbury's, is contrary to the NP and is not being supported by the PC, principally because of the resultant net



loss of employment, the loss of the 18 businesses and services currently in Chiltern House at a time when a similar supermarket has been approved a short distance away as part of the airfield development, and the loss of seed-bed accommodation so valuable for business start-ups.

- 1. Site on Dollicott opposite The Closes: proposal by Cala Homes for 25 houses.
- 2. Site behind 24-32 Dollicott: proposal by WE Black for 10 houses.
- 3. Site on the east side Stanbridge Road north of the Garden Centre: proposal by Rectory Homes for 43 dwellings.
- 4. Site on the northeast corner of Haddenham Business Park for a 2 hectare extension for industry.
- 5. Change of use and conversion of Chiltern House, Thame Road, from business to retail; proposal for a Sainsbury's Local supermarket.

The Scarecrow Festival will be launched at Haddenham Fete on 11th June, where Scarecrow Trail maps will be available from the Scout and Guide Association's stall, in return for a £1 donation towards the Florence Nightingale Hospice charity. It is hoped to make Scarecrow Trail maps available from other locations in the village from 11th June (see local publicity for more details).

Murder in the Haddenham Museum

The latest display in the Museum records episodes of Midsomer Murders which were filmed in Haddenham between 2000 and 2015. The village was variously called Midsomer Magna, Midsomer Worthy, Fletcher's Cross and Malham Bridge. There are photographs of the filming, including the involvement of the Mummers and local schoolchildren. There is a village map showing all the locations, for sale in the Museum - just the thing to send to Midsomer fans around the world! The display coincides with the publication of the excellent new book of walks, 'Roaming Midsomer' by local authors Martin Andrew and Chris Behan. As many will know, Midsomer coach parties from far and wide stop in the village to point out various locations

The Museum now also has a fascinating series of some 40 large photographs contrasting scenes around the village in 1900 and nowadays. In April the Museum hosted a meeting of the Haddenham U3A Local History group at which Alan Rose explained some of the interesting artefacts, including the constable's truncheon from the reign of William the Fourth (1830-37).

The DVD 'A Village for Today' is being updated with some new filming at the May Day celebrations on the Green on 7 May. In June, the Buckinghamshire Historical Association will visit the Museum, followed by a guided walk round the Village.

Haddenham Community Vehicle - Now FREE

As reported in the the previous Village News, the Haddenham Community Vehicle (HCV) is now fully operational, providing the Enabling Travel for All transport service for disabled passengers in the community. Those having limited mobility need no longer be stuck at home.

Thanks to the generosity of local donors, the committee are now able to provide a free service within the local area. Day-to-day running costs will be met from these donations, although users might like to make a voluntary donation.

The defined local area is broadly that served by the Haddenham Medical Centre, which includes Scotsgrove, Chearsley, Hartwell and Longwick. Users living outside this area will be charged a fare based on 70p per vehicle mile.

Haddenham Community Library

The Community Library continues to flourish, providing opportunities for local groups and families to enjoy a range of activities, not just the 'usual' library services of books, internet access and wi-fi, newspapers and magazines.

Recently the Library organised a creative writing competition for local schools. Over 100 entries were received, based on reading 'Arnie Jenks and the House of Strangers' by Tim Bradley, a local author. In the book Arnie travels back in time and meets various characters. Pupils were asked to write about him meeting a new character. Emma Foster, the library manager, is visiting the schools to present prizes.

On 23 April, the library took part in World Book Night, an annual event run by The Reading Agency. The Library applied for the official 15 books and received four boxes of them which were given out at the station to passengers coming and going.

Heartbeat Haddenham

Thanks to the generosity of many residents and organisations in Haddenham, we have now been able to complete the installation of six defibrillators in the village, and also to run five CPR familiarisation courses on a free of charge basis, plus courses for all the brownie, guide and scout groups in the village. Each defibrillator has a backup warranty for ten years, so that we are covered for repairs and replacement parts in case of usage.

The units are located in convenient points around the village - if you would like to see the map of these, and learn about CPR, please come to our stall at the Fete on June 11th, or contact Tony Warris on 01844 292273: but remember : YOU MUST RING THE 999 OPERATOR IN CASE OF EMERGENCY, THEY WILL SEND AN AMBULANCE, AND GIVE YOU THE LOCATION OF THE NEAREST UNIT, AND THE CODE TO OPEN THE CABINET. After that, the operation of the defibrillator is self – explanatory, and very simple.

Young photographer competition

The last edition of the Village News included a reminder that the Rotary Club of Haddenham and District were again running their very successful competition for young photographers in three age groups (7-10. 11-13 and 14-18). The closing date has now passed and there has been a great response with many entries for the judges, including top local photographer Paul Wilkinson, to assess. Turn End turns 50

Older villagers will be well aware of the houses and garden at Turn End in Townside. More recent residents may welcome a bit of the history and plans for the future.

50 years ago Peter and Margaret Aldington bought the plot between Townside and the High St. Peter was a well-known architect with the London County Council and his ambition was to create a house (three in the event) and a garden which would embody his design principles. Though modern, these include many features typical of local buildings: roofs at different angles and heights; weather boarding; high walls and windows, typical of local barns or barn conversions; frontages facing the south; buildings clustered together around a yard; and the use of wychert-style walls.

The result is what we see today – one of the few 20th century houses awarded Grade 2* listed status which is visited by architects and designers from far and wide - together with a garden of great beauty and interest. Turn End is wonderfully described and illustrated in the book 'A garden and three houses' by Jane Brown and Richard Bryant.

Turn End was only made possible by the indefatigable efforts of Peter and Margaret to overturn a silly planning restriction on building in the village. Eventually they got the go-ahead, with the support of the local MP. Friends and neighbours helped them to make it happen. Margaret has vividly described all this in The Haddenham Chronicles Number Ten.

To ensure that Turn End continues to fascinate and delight, Turn End Trust has been established, to care for the houses and garden in future. The Trust has begun a programme of events and has started a Friends scheme.



To celebrate the 50th anniversary, this year's events include an NGS open garden afternoon, a 10-day sculpture exhibition, a 50th anniversary party, a guest talk by Richard Bisgrove, and an Open House and Garden day in September.

- Provision and maintenance of Street lights, benches, and dog waste bins
- Managing the Allotments, Community Orchard and Snakemoor Nature Reserve.
- Finance budget setting, governance and accountability, risk assessment
- Fund raising and grant applications
- Organising events Haddenham Fete, Annual Parish Meeting, Public Consultations
- Communications editing the village newsletter, managing the website
- Special projects for example Heartbeat Haddenham defibrillator project

You don't need to bring specific skills as enthusiasm and a willingness to work as a team to support your community are all that is needed.

You will need to be available on Monday evenings to attend Parish Council meetings. The full Parish Council meets 11 times a year on the first Monday of every month except August. Peking Rendezvous development starts

Work has begun this month of the development of the former Perking Rendezvous site by local builders Bellwood Homes. There will be six houses, reaching back to Stockwell, with two on the High Street frontage built in a wichert style. Computer generated images of the houses are shown on the hoardings round the site. Thames Valley Archaeological Services have carried out a dig and found a small amount of medieval pottery which will eventually be displayed in Haddenham Museum. The planning approval contains conditions aimed at minimising the impact of construction traffic. The only entrance to the site will be from the High Street. The developer has proposed that the name should be Waggoners Court, after the former pub Waggon and Horses which was on the site.

Snakemoor Nature Reserve

Snakemoor has had an excellent start to the year. There have been many visitors enjoying the succession of spring flowers. These started with a fantastic show of snowdrops and more recently our meadow fritillaries. Our English bluebells are increasing in some areas, starting to make a carpet of blue.

The reserve thrives as a result of generous donations and the volunteers who give their time and effort. Many thanks for this and for the leadership Robyn Thorogood provides.

It is always great to see children enjoying the reserve but it is important that guardians ensure they obey the few rules we have. Visitors are asked not to block access to the entrance gate when parking. There have been a few times when planned work was abandoned because access was blocked.

A final point of interest: There are 4 young elm trees that are part of the Great British Elm Experiment –see their web site. Hopefully they will be resistant to the Dutch elm disease.

Wanted: Volunteer Directors for Haddenham Youth & Community Centre

How would you like to serve as a volunteer director of the Haddenham Youth & Community Centre? The centre is attached to (but managed independently from) the Junior School on Woodways. It is owned by Bucks County Council (BCC), which for many years ran a youth service there. Because of cutbacks, in 2011 BCC had to withdraw from youth work in the village. Haddenham Youth & Community Centre (HYCC) was established as both a charity and a limited company to take over responsibility from BCC for directly running the centre. HYCC was given a lease by BCC, plus an initial set-up grant to provide a new youth service. Since 2011 HYCC has commissioned a youth service from an external provider which currently runs youth clubs on two evenings a week. At other times HYCC lets the centre to a variety of regular hirers, and for one-off events. The income generated has to meet all expenses in managing the centre. HYCC's directors are volunteers from the village who meet about four evenings a year to plan and review the youth programme, bookings, condition of the premises, and the budget. HYCC is now seeking new director(s) to take the centre forward into the future. If you are interested in finding out more, please contact the chair of HYCC, David Palmer, via the Parish Office.

Egg House Butchery at House of Lords

The Countryside Alliance organises an awards event, one category in which is butchers' shops. Customers can nominate their favourite shop and the entries are then judged on their input to the industry and the community. The Egg House Butchery in Haddenham was nominated and reached the finals, with a presentation at the House of Lords. This is quite a feather in the cap of a village business and reflects great credit on Ricky Jeffrey and his team.



Future of pharmacies

In December 2015, the Department of Health and NHS England announced a 6% reduction in funding for community pharmacy contracts. This could have a serious effect on local pharmacies across the country. JMW Vicary at the Haddenham Medical Centre offers a high quality of care and service and it would be a great loss to the village if their funding was reduced. Patients are invited to sign the petition in the pharmacy, aimed at preserving current levels of funding and service.

Chronicles No. 14 launched

The 14th issue of The Haddenham Chronicles was launched at the May Day celebrations on the Green on May 7th, marking the 10th anniversary of the project. Subjects covered in Number 14 include Jewish Refugees at Tythrop in the 30s, Haddenham Windmills, Grazing rights in the 18th and 19th centuries, Harvesting during World War Two and the Spicers Factory.
