Haddenham **NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN**

We've got it made!

The 16th July 2015 was a historic day for Haddenham: the polling day on whether to accept the Neighbourhood Plan. Over half the village electorate turned out to vote, delivering an emphatic "yes", with 1712 (86%) votes for, and 273 (14%) against. The plan then went to Aylesbury Vale District Council who "made" the plan (that is formally accepted it) which they did at the beginning of September. Our Plan is now a formal recognised document, to be considered in drafting of the Vale of Aylesbury Local Plan (VALP), itself due to be adopted in summer 2017. Meanwhile, our Plan will have to be considered in any planning applications.

But the Plan is not only about housing - it's about sport, leisure, recreation and village amenities tooalthough it is housing growth that inevitably makes the headlines. The Plan allows for 430 new homes,



and you can see the sites on the Parish Council website. During the summer, there was a flurry of emails which villagers may have seen suggesting that recent Court cases could undermine the weight given Neighbourhood Plans in planning applications. Because AVDC has failed to adopt its own Local Plan yet and crucially does not have the supply of new housing in the pipeline. However, Haddenham Parish Council is convinced our community is in a stronger position because of our Neighbourhood Plan. Meanwhile our Parish Council joins other voices in the Vale urging our AVDC Councillors to use discretion to give full weight over and above developer

interests where Neighbourhood Plans have been

developed by communities.

Haddenham Community Orchard

Haddenham Parish Council has taken ownership of the field adjacent to Townsend Green, one of the benefits from the development at Stokes Croft. Using the land as a community orchard was voted for by the village in 2014 as a legacy for this and future generations of villagers. The creation of the orchard can now begin in earnest. The Orchard Committee, a sub group of the Parish Council Environment Committee will manage the orchard and there a number of community events planned over the next few months which we hope will attract a large number of Haddenham residents

A professional orchard designer has designed a layout using a range of old varieties of apple, pear, cherry and plum trees. The final design includes soft fruit bushes and wild flowers with an integral seating area. The Committee believe that the orchard will encourage the village residents to engage in its creation and maintenance in addition to harvesting the free fruit! Local schools will be able to use the orchard for educational purposes throughout the year. The Committee plan to hold at least two public events a year such as celebrating midsummer, apple pressing, or even fruit cookery classes.

Now the Committee needs to raise the funds to purchase the saplings, bushes, protection and support for the plants, sign boards and furniture. The budget for the complete orchard is £4,000 and whilst there are some grants from local charities, the Committee aims to raise the majority of the funds from private donors.

Update on Heartbeat Haddenham

Heartbeat Haddenham has now installed public access defibrillators at the railway station, the sports pavilion on Woodways, and at Abbeyfields. Together with the one outside the library, there are now four fully operational units up and running in the village. There is another unit which will be sited at Church End when appropriate permissions have been granted and two further units for other sites in the village. In the Autumn, Heartbeat Haddenham will be running CPR and defibrillator familiarisation courses. Look out for news on Haddenham.net and in the Bucks Herald.

What's Happening with the Environment Committee?

Chris Young, Chair of the Environment Committee gives an update on this busy group.

Matters dealt with by the Environment Committee have not had such a high profile as the Neighbourhood Plan, but, nevertheless, are very important to the life in the village.

For example, Buckinghamshire County Council have passed responsibility to the Parish Council for the maintenance of local footpaths and all grass cutting of verges inside the 30 MPH limit. External contractors have been hired to do the large volume of work and as September will be the 3rd cut since this change has taken place, they are now familiar with the various quirks of Haddenham's grassy areas.

The pond at Rudds Lane has been dredged and the sludge and silt has been removed and disposed of at a recognised site. We also took the opportunity to give the neighbouring trees a haircut. Church pond has had the sleepers replaced and disposable matting has been installed to give the grass a chance to grow back. To ensure that the grass is undisturbed, please respect the guard ropes and keep off the enclosed area.

Buckinghamshire County Council have promised to finally start work on the proposed Zebra Crossing in Woodways by the two schools in September. We will meet with Transport for Bucks soon to review the costs currently estimated at £84,000, which will be met by a New Homes Bonus grant from Aylesbury Vale District Council.

Meanwhile we continue to work with Buckingham County Council to attempt to resolve the car parking problems in the Sheerstock and Wykeham Way area We have been very grateful for the support from villagers affected by commuters leaving their cars on the street.

The village street lights are a particular problem as we are no longer allowed to renew lights on telephone poles and many are getting very old. We have developed a replacement programme and put extra money aside from the budget to cover additional costs.

The View from F&GP

The PC's unappealingly called F&GP Committee stands for Finance & General Purposes – enough to frighten anyone away! But this Committee is responsible for planning and spending the PC's budget, managing its staff, buildings and assets including Banks Park and the Willis Road Playing Fields, and indeed anything not covered by the other main Committees – which can make for a heavy workload. It meets on the 4th Monday of the month.

What has F&GP been up to in recent months? We have bedded in an entirely new way of managing the budget following a full review and going digital, bringing us firmly into the 21st century. We have reviewed an audit report on these new arrangements, are preparing for compulsory pensions from next year, and are reviewing a raft of policies and procedures to ensure we are at the forefront of best local council practice. We are recruiting a new part-time Assistant Parish Clerk to help us take on new responsibilities like devolved services from the County Council, and following up the Neighbourhood Plan.

Major recent expenditure in the last quarter has included £13,599 to remove silt from Rudds Pond; £12,454 to replace rotted iron railings around Banks Park; £3,100 to reinstate collapsed banks at Church End pond; and £2,460 on tree work mainly at Banks Park and Rudds Pond.

Next projects include repairs to the dentist's surgery at Banks Cottage and the wychert wall along Banks Road; a pedestrian crossing at Woodways funded by the New Homes bonus; working with the County Council to seek potential funding for the Sheerstock Parking proposals; and with the developer of the Airfield site to secure funding for major new sports and leisure facilities. Fundraising is taking place for trees for Townsend Community Orchard, for Heartbeat Haddenham defibrillators, and the continued maintenance of Snakemoor. So never a dull moment!

The Haddenham Feast

Have you ever wondered why the fair visits Haddenham each year around this time? It is to celebrate the Haddenham Feast. The feast is an ancient festival to celebrate the harvest on the Sunday with the fair day the next day. Apparently, its strange timing- the Sunday after the third Thursday in September - is to do with the feast being set according a calendar used before our current Gregorian calendar.

Do you trip along or trip up the pavements of Haddenham?

Haddenham Safe Walking and Cycling Group are conducting a survey of the state of Haddenham's walkways. Cynthia Floud, Chair of the group gives an update.

'Our pavement survey has identified some spots where there is a chance of tripping up, other places where hedges and brambles have overgrown and, if you are in a wheelchair or pushing a buggy, you may have to go into the road. We have also noted where the size of the potholes in the road mean that pedestrians could get a soaking, when vehicles plough through the inevitable puddles. We think that pavements are at least as important as roads, where their upkeep is concerned, for the safety and comfort of residents. The results of the survey will be shared with the Parish Council.

We can also report that our campaign to persuade car owners not to park on pavements is going well. Cards are available from the Parish Office, which you can put on the windscreen of poorly parked cars, to remind them that pavements are for people. Our PCSO, Sue Jones, tells us all to photograph the number plates of repeat offenders and send the photos to her at

suzan.jones@thamesvalley.pnn.police.uk.

Cars parked at the roadside may slow the traffic down and obstruct the flow, but this is a good thing from the point of view of pedestrians, children and cyclists. Most motorists are pedestrians too, so it will benefit them. While out surveying, we have discovered some pavements which have been damaged by cars being parked on them: kerbstones dislodged or asphalt worn away. Thus our two campaigns 'Twenty's Plenty' and the Pavement Survey have merged to focus our attention on Haddenham's pavements and their role in the safety of villagers.'

Training for Parish Councillors

Becoming a parish councillor can be a daunting prospect, but thankfully there is an organisation that provides



support. Known by another awkward acronym 'BMKALC', the Buckinghamshire and Milton Keynes Association of Local Councils have an excellent trainer Carole Burslem who run a half day course for parish councillors on Saturday 19th September. The Haddenham Parish Councillors welcomed our colleagues from all corners of Buckinghamshire training held in our very own Walter Rose Room. Even the most seasoned councillor learned something new, thanks to Carole's encyclopaedic knowledge. It was really surprising to hear that whilst the parish council has little powers in comparison to Aylesbury Vale District Council or Buckinghamshire County Council, we do a few. For example:

The power to provide allotments and which are to be found between Townside and Sheerstock. Our allotments are well look after by Alison Watt with John Wheeler. Allotment rents are due now so if you have received your invoice, please do pay promptly. The demand for allotments has increased over the years but people giving up allotments often do so at this time of year, so if you are interested in being added to the waiting list, contact Alison (see contacts at the back of the newsletter).

Have regard to the protection of the bio-diversity of the area. Now that we undertake some of the grass cutting, we can ensure that the timing allows the wild flowers to seed on the grass verges, an increasingly important site for our native flora. All work on the ponds has been carried out with consideration of the wild life within them.

The Power to provide baths and wash houses. Whilst we are not totally convinced of the need in Haddenham, this is the sort of power that could straight to you head. Have yet to see the 'ability to provide a bath house' rank in anyone's list of most desired super power, it's nice to know if we really wanted to, we could.

The group learned that parish councillors are officially 'holders of public office' and so not counted as volunteers, despite receiving no payment for the time given in council duties – including giving up Saturday mornings to attend training. Anyone interested in becoming a councillor or being co-opted onto one of the sub groups can contact Sue Gilbert at the Parish Office for more information.


