A Parish Councillor for 15 years, John chairs the Allotments and Snakemoor committees and is Vice-Chair of the Environment Committee.

Steve Sharp Steve has lived in Haddenham since 1984. He worked for the County Council's education service until 1996, when he became an education consultant. Later, he was Operations Director of The Duke of Edinburgh Award. Steve serves on the F&GP, Planning and Personnel committees. Steve's interests include editing *The Haddenham Chronicles* for the Haddenham Museum Trust, chairing the Trustees of the Community Library, walking, cricket, crosswords and four young grandchildren.

Amanda Capp The current editor of the quarterly *Haddenham Village Newsletter*, Amanda joined the Parish Council a year ago. She is on the Communications and Environment committees and has lived in Haddenham since 2013. Amanda has 14 years' experience in communications, most recently working for Deloitte and the Financial Conduct Authority. Amanda enjoys playing the piano, learning German and looking after her daughter.

David Lyons David – who sits on the Environment and Communications committees – has lived in Haddenham for 12 years and works as a railway engineer in London. He is most concerned that decisions taken now about how the village and its surroundings take into account likely changes in the national and global economy and environment. One of his biggest concerns is that the community can be resilient and provide the necessities of life (e.g. food) in times of energy shortage, climate change and economic decline.

Tom Newton Tom, who joined the Parish Council two years ago, has a background in IT and was raised in Haddenham. On the Planning and Communications committees, Tom became a Councillor because he felt the younger generation needed representation and wanted to give something back to the community in which he was raised and contribute to the village as a whole.

What is a Parish Council?

- An elected body in the first tier of government
- Legally granted powers by Parliament to raise money through taxation ("a precept") and a range of powers to spend public money

What do Parish Councillors do?

- Unpaid volunteers who work together to serve the community
- Bring issues to the attention of the council, and help it make decisions on behalf of the local community

What does your Parish Council do?

Responsibilities include: planning; parking spaces; traffic signs and other notices; burial grounds; allotments; bus shelters; lighting; verge and footpath maintenance; community centres; litter; recreation grounds; public seats (e.g. benches); traffic calming; war memorials.

Village maintenance – new contractors signed



The Parish Council has signed contracts with two new contractors. Following the departure in 2016 of our resident handyman, the not-for-proft social enterprise 'Aspire' was appointed to carry out maintenance in Haddenham from April to October 2017. The multi-award winning Oxford charity, Aspire, provides recovery, training and work experience to men and women with disadvantaged backgrounds, offering them a viable route back to employment. The Parish Council has also officially taken on responsibility for maintenance for St Mary's churchyard. We are retaining the services of the church's current contractor, Westbury, and will be signing a new contract shortly.

Speeding drivers beware!

With the aim of reducing speeding in the village, Haddenham will shortly be the coowner of a Sentinel – a small, discrete, digital camera with a rechargeable battery. Using advanced speed



detection technology and a high-quality digital video to capture speeding vehicles, the Sentinel is small, light and easily moved around the village. Volunteers will man the system, with two already in place! The Sentinel is being funded by the Haddenham & Long Crendon Local Area Forum and contributions from the 13 parishes which will share its use. Haddenham will also be responsible for storing and booking the Sentinel in and out. Using the Sentinel is simple and straightforward, and any volunteers are encouraged to contact Sue, the Parish Clerk.

Haddenham War Memorial now Grade II listed!

A poignant memorial to those lost by Haddenham in the First and Second World Wars, Historic England has granted Haddenham War Memorial Grade II listing, following a successful application by Nick Burch.

In its report, Historic England stated that the War Memorial was particularly noteworthy, set in a railed enclosure on the village green, with the listed cross and a



number of listed buildings nearby. The War Memorial itself is a Portland stone obelisk with detailing on the ball finial including acanthus, thistle, shamrock and rose.

The War Memorial was inaugurated on 16 October 1921, by the Marquis of Lincolnshire, the Lord Lieutenant of Buckinghamshire. The parish of Haddenham had sadly lost 59 men from the First World War, with the names of nine men added after the Second World War. Parking Restrictions: Phase One completed

Following our February issue update, Phase One of the parking restrictions scheme to address the urgent need to introduce restrictions where there were serious safety concerns has been completed.

Following a very serious traffic accident in High Wycombe which delayed the project until Easter, a traffic regulation order was made, and the following plans, which enforce Highway Code safety advice, have been introduced:

- a new clearway from Station Road to the entrance to the station
- sections of double yellow lines on Thame Road, Sheerstock and Wykeham Way; and
- an extension of the Pegasus Way clearway up to the A418.

Residents have asked why a short section of double yellow lines has been left out on Thame Road outside the station. According to Buckinghamshire County Council's "Vision for Parking", they aim to control parking where necessary and allow parking where possible, and this approach was used to introduce restrictions in Haddenham.

The impact of these restrictions will be monitored and, if necessary, a Phase Two will address additional issues.

Margaret Aston steps down from Bucks County Council

After 24 years serving as a Buckinghamshire County Councillor for the Bernwood division, Margaret Aston stepped down on Thursday 4th May. She is looking forward to becoming an Independent Member for the Fostering Panel. Margaret's wide range of experience on the fostering panel means that she is highly sought after at BCC, as she has served on both the fostering and adoption panels.



With representing and working for her community and having a close and personal involvement in cases the most rewarding part of her work, the bulk of Margaret's experience has been in Health and Children's Services. She has chaired the Appeals and Complaints and Home to School Transport panels, and sat on committees including Adult Social Care and Education. Margaret has served on a number of outside bodies, Carers Bucks, Aylesbury Medical Ethics Committee, Aylesbury Vale Community Health Council and Aylesbury and Milton Keynes Valuation Tribunal.

Recently her cabinet involvement has been with Public Health and Community Issues. Margaret was a founder member of Abbeyfield Haddenham and was elected to the Abbeyfield National Committee on which she served for 12 years; six years as National Chairman of Care and Development.

On the education front, Margaret was School Governor of Haddenham Community Junior School for 20 years, Governor of Henry Floyd School, Aylesbury High School and Aylesbury College for eight years each.

Born in Wimbledon, Margaret has lived in Haddenham since 1963 with her husband and children and was elected to Buckinghamshire County Council in 1993. Margaret has also served for 40 years on Haddenham Parish Council where she is currently Vice-Chair.

Parish Council Casual Vacancy

Resignation of Cllr Tim Armitt

The Parish Council is very sad to say goodbye to Tim Armitt who has been a Parish Councillor since September 2011. Tim has served as the Parish Council representative on the Fete Committee and is key in organising this annual event. The Fete has raised thousands of pounds for local charities and voluntary organisations. We wish Tim and his wife Sheilagh well as they move on to a new chapter in their lives.

Have you ever thought about becoming a Parish Councillor?

The Parish Council has a Casual Vacancy which needs to be filled. Notice of the vacancy was served on 28th April 2017. If 10 electors of the Parish give notice to the returning officer within 14 days of that date requesting an election, this will be held. If no election is requested the vacancy will be filled by co-option. This will be formally advertised and take place at the Parish Council meeting on Tuesday 6th June 2017.

What does a Parish Councillor do?

Parish Councillors work together to serve the community. They come from different backgrounds and bring a diverse range of skills. Teamwork is important as no individual councillor can act in isolation. Haddenham Parish Councillors are currently involved with:

- Planning commenting on planning applications, supporting the Neighbourhood Plan, working with AVDC and developers
- Managing open spaces at Woodways, Sheerstock and Banks Park
- Providing and maintaining street lights, benches and dog waste bins
- Managing the Allotments, Community Orchard and Snakemoor Nature Reserve.
- Finance budget setting, risk assessment and governance and accountability
- Fund raising and grant applications
- Organising events Haddenham Fete, Public Consultations and the Annual Parish Meeting
- Communications editing the village newsletter and managing the website
- Special projects Heartbeat Haddenham, Townsend Community Orchard, Woodways Crossing, cycle paths, parking, new community facilities, new burial ground.

No specific skills are required, as enthusiasm and a willingness to work as a team to support your community are what is needed.

Parish Council Meetings

You will need to be available on Monday evenings to attend Parish Council meetings. The full Parish Council meets 11 times a year on the first Monday of every month except August. The Parish Council has six standing committees: Environment, Finance & General Purposes, Planning, Allotments, Personnel and Communications, plus sub-committees.

New village noticeboards

Three new noticeboards have been erected around the village – opposite the post office, opposite the library, and outside the entrance to Woodways playing fields. Owned by the Parish Council, they publish community information for residents and visitors to

Haddenham. Notices must:
publicise activities and events or statutory public documents of non-profit, non-political organisations

- be posted no more than two weeks in advance of an event and removed immediately after the event has occurred
- publicise activities or events happening within Haddenham Parish and its immediate neighbours and be specifically relevant to the community
- be limited to a maximum size of A4 (210mm× 297mm) or (8.27 × 11.69 inches)
- be attached by the use of the magnets provided
- clearly state the name of the organisation issuing the notice
- include a summary in English if the main information is displayed in another language

Active Vale supporting women to get fit!

FOCUS ON...Finance & General Purposes (F&GP)

F&GP manages the finances and the overall direction of the Parish Council. Each year, F&GP sets the budget and precept – the parish's portion of the Council Tax. The committee monitors spending against budgets, reviews best practice, policies and procedures, and as the village grows, anticipates future calls on services and resources. Currently these include becoming a burial authority and delivering a new burial ground; building and managing new sports and recreation facilities; a fresh approach to village maintenance; and shortly, responding to a new unitary authority, possibly taking on additional devolved services.

AVDC provides a bulky waste collection service and collects up to three items for a flat fee of $\mathfrak{L}75$. Small electrical goods and textiles are picked up for free when you book a collection.

Quarterly update: Rt Hon John Bercow, MP for Buckingham and Speaker of the House of Commons

As I write this, my inaugural column for Haddenham Village News, Parliament is in Recess – but the work does not stop. MPs use the Recess for different



purposes, but mine has been dominated by constituency work. Every day, I receive letters and emails from constituents on a variety of matters – from concerns about their housing situation and health problems to wider, national or international issues – most notably, Brexit and the unravelling situation in Syria.

While MPs have an important job as legislators, they also undertake significant constituency duties. Issues at the top of my agenda include East-West Rail and the perennial problems presented by High Speed 2. I am pressing Government Ministers and others to ensure my constituency, and its residents, get the best possible deal – and while every battle cannot be won, I will fight hard for North Buckinghamshire.

In the coming weeks, I will meet with the Chief Executive of Chiltern Railways for an update on rail services serving, among other places, Haddenham and Thame Parkway. Although Chiltern Railways fares well in customer satisfaction ratings compared to other train operators, I am not unfamiliar with concerns about delays and over-crowding and I will continue to press the organisation to find appropriate solutions.

I am delighted to note that 2017 marks the fifth anniversary of the Haddenham Community Library – a project which demonstrates the sheer strength and determination of the village. I am looking forward to marking this milestone later in the year with the library staff and volunteers and hopefully meeting with Haddenham Village News readers in the non-fiction section!

I wish you a happy, relaxing summer.

Tribute to Stewart Sloan, a local force for good!

Stewart Sloan, a former Haddenham School Governor and Parish and District Councillor, died aged 70 in March. Since moving to Haddenham in 1970, Stewart had made a huge contribution to the village, founding the successful holiday play-scheme, serving on the



While Stewart began his career at the Aylesbury-based agricultural machinery manufacturer, New Holland, his subsequent "dream job" as a buyer for Bridge Oil Services Overseas regularly took him to Guinea, West Africa on various projects for a diamond mine. Although he later worked in purchasing both locally and in Saudi Arabia, his love of DIY led him to set up as a handyman, leaving a proud contribution of many new bathrooms and kitchens in homes around the Haddenham area!

Stewart's many interests included the restoration of canals, folk music, working on his allotment, and helping his children with their houses and passing on his significant DIY and gardening skills. Stewart also loved driving and showing his Triumph Spitfire, having first owned one in his early twenties.

Stewart is survived by his wife Gill, his three children, Christopher, Caroline and Robert, and his four grandchildren.

Haddenham Village Society – a key role!

The Haddenham Village Society – founded in 1965 – is playing a more important role today than ever before! With mounting pressure on Haddenham to absorb additional housing and light industry, the Society's role of organising social events and talks on Haddenham themes, supporting community groups, and making representations on planning applications and other issues affecting the village is key in this fast-changing environment.

The Village Society believes growth should not sacrifice the traditional village ethos and community spirit, and objects to development without a strategic plan or due regard for Haddenham's historic areas, many of which are in the Conservation Area.

The Haddenham Neighbourhood Plan's housing development chapter was struck out after litigation by an aggressive developer in 2016, despite villagers' official recognition, while the Vale of Aylesbury Local Plan is being re-written following new Government policy guidelines.

We may consequently require a revised Haddenham Neighbourhood Plan, particularly if we are included in the Oxford to Cambridge development area. The Society will contribute to the new plan, and would like villagers to participate. This will help ensure that as Haddenham expands, facilities are developed and improved and its traditional ethos and community spirit are sustained – it is vital this is done strategically.

Community Library looking to the future!

Now in its fifth year partnering with Bucks County Council, the Library is confident its current agreement will be extended. Plans are underway to celebrate our fifth anniversary this autumn with events involving illustrious figures from the literary and arts world.

Meanwhile, regular events – including Bridge Club meetings, knitting and spinning groups, Bounce and Rhyme, and craft and Lego clubs – ensure its continued appeal. Haddenham Village Society holds its monthly meetings while local artists and Rotary have regular displays. The library hosts a local food bank drop-in, while bookable sessions for assistance using computers and tablets are available. This forms part of our mission to be a community hub.

Community partnership – the agreement between Haddenham Screen and the community library continues apace. The library acts as the box office for the Screen and profits go to the library, with donations this year amounting to £2,750. Keep watching the films!

Thanks to the popularity of these events and the library's appeal as a venue for community activities, trustees plan to extend the building to provide a separate meeting room and a lavatory. A planning application will be submitted to AVDC this summer. Watch this space!

Calling all Scarecrow designers!

Following last year's successful Scarecrow Festival, the Haddenham Association of Scouts and Guides is challenging the village to create Scarecrows in all shapes and sizes. These will be displayed from Saturday 10th June until Sunday 25th June.

Haddafact: Infamous Haddenham Fields murderers hanged!

On October 25th 1828, Thame market gardener William Edden was murdered in Haddenham Fields returning home from Aylesbury market. Two local men – Benjamin Tyler and Solomon Sewell – were tried for his murder. The trial, which was reported in detail in The Times and the Bucks Gazette – involved 40 witnesses. In March 1830 they were found guilty and hanged in Aylesbury market square before a 3,000-strong crowd.

Public hangings were abolished following another notorious hanging in Aylesbury in 1845. The Haddenham Fields case is described in full detail in a booklet published by the Haddenham Museum. Read about the wider issue of capital punishment in The Haddenham Chronicles no 15.

Scamming: an update

Following our update in our February issue, scams remain an ongoing problem. There are many different types of scams, including online fraud and identity theft. To protect yourself, follow the following advice:

- Never give any personal information out before verifying credentials
- Many scams start with a phishing email (an attempt to acquire sensitive information). Banks and financial institutions will never send you an email asking you to confirm your bank details.
- Destroy receipts with your card details on, and post with your name and address.
- Ensure up-to-date anti-virus software and a firewall is installed on your computer, and your browser has the highest level of security notification and monitoring to prevent malware issues.
- Act immediately if you receive bills, invoices or receipts for things you haven't bought or financial institutions you don't normally deal with contacting you about outstanding debts.
- Regularly check your credit file for entries you don't recognize.
- Be wary of post, phone calls or emails offering you business deals. If an offer seems too good to be true, it probably is. Always question it.
- If you have been a victim of fraud, be aware of fraud recovery fraud (where fraudsters pretend to help you recover your money).




