Parish Council takes a lead in responding to local plans

In the draft Vale of Aylesbury Local Plan (VALP) Haddenham is proposed for growth both as a strategic settlement and as frontrunner for a new settlement, and as such has been singled out for singular treatment.


In summary, the Parish Council accepts Haddenham's contribution of 1059 homes to local housing need within the Vale of some 21,000 homes, subject to caveats. The Parish Council objects to the new settlement proposals, which would amount to the destruction of our village and community, in order to provide overspill for and to safeguard neighbouring Districts. Our objections are set out under the following heads:

- The duty to cooperate with neighbouring District Councils
- Optimising density within VALP
- Combined impact of growth in the M40/Chiltern railway corridor by different authorities
- Highway infrastructure around Haddenham
- Harm to heritage and community
- Loss of high grade agricultural land
- Competing with Aylesbury
- Deliverability

Since AVDC launched their consultation on 7th July the Parish Council has:

 Produced and delivered two special editions of Haddenham Village News. Edition 86 was distributed at the beginning of July. It summarised the proposals affecting Haddenham, drew attention to forthcoming events in the village, and advised how to respond. Edition 87 was distributed in August, gave further

information on the new settlement proposals, and summarised the issues discussed at the public meeting. Our grateful thanks to the team of volunteer distributors.



 Organised and hosted a public meeting in the Village Hall on 28th July, and presented a summary of the issues. The meeting was attended by 200 residents, our 3 District Councillors, and AVDC senior staff.

- Submitted our response to Wycombe District Council in response to its Local Plan consultation arising from the impact on Haddenham.
- Attended as guests of Thame Town Council a public meeting on 4th August hosted by TTC on South Oxfordshire District Council's Local Plan consultation. A packed St Mary's Church in Thame was concerned to learn about the proposals for Haddenham.
- Submitted our response to South Oxfordshire District Council's Local Plan consultation.
- Prepared and submitted a full response to AVDC on the draft VALP which is available on the Parish Council's web-site.

It is extremely difficult to remove the paint from witchert walls, many of which are in the conservation area.

Say NO to parking on pavements and grass verges

Please do not park on the pavement or grass verge. It costs the council thousands of pounds to maintain pavements and grass verges that have been damaged by vehicles parking on them.

The Highway Code rule 244 states that you must not park on the pavement in London and "...should not do so elsewhere unless signs permit it. Parking on the pavement can obstruct and seriously inconvenience pedestrians, people in wheelchairs or with visual impairments and people with prams or pushchairs.'

Church End Green and Townsend Green are being gradually eroded and their verges seriously damaged by the number of cars parking, particularly during the school run. It is an offence to park vehicles on these registered village greens, which are owned by the Parish Council and which are designated public open spaces. We are working with St Mary's School and the Church to prevent parking on the green on the school run, and for weddings and funerals.

Please be considerate to your neighbours and think about how your actions affect Haddenham long term.

Overgrown footpaths? Time for a trim!

Townsend Community Orchard

What's been achieved so far?

All the trees planted by people who live and work in Haddenham survived their first winter and have thrived through the summer. It has been a pleasure to see a wide range of wild flowers and grasses bursting through to create an idyllic setting for this new community resource. Between May and July over 25 wildflower species were identified in the orchard including ox-eye daisy, creeping buttercup, red/white campions, common vetch, ragged robin, black medick, red/white clover, common field speedwell and cut-leaved cranesbill. About ten different meadow grass species were also seen but next year we need a grass expert to come and help identify them - any volunteers?"

Not much was expected in the way of produce from the trees but some are fruiting. The Orchard group and the many helpers will continue to monitor the trees and take action wherever required.

Environment care

From the start the orchard has been planned as a community project and not a commercial orchard. This has meant encouraging wild flowers and meadow grasses to create a natural feel and provide a green space that everyone can enjoy. The grass will be cut just twice a year but we will keep the space clear around each tree and cut pathways so that walkers can fully enjoy the orchard. This will give the wildflowers the best chance to thrive.

What's next?

You will have noticed a space that is clear of trees and wildflowers. This area is 'The Core', and is designed as an event space, outdoor classroom, open air theatre, and picnic area. Efforts are currently underway to secure funds for 'natural' seating that will be flexible enough to cater for all needs. We will also design and install an information board and identification plaques for each tree.

Lessons learnt

Common ragwort, thistle and cow parsley are being monitored. These can be an issue but are not a problem at this stage. A few visitors to the orchard have been a little concerned by apparent inaction.

The orchard group enthusiastically embraced the idea of soft fruit bushes. These plants need more regular maintenance and care than the trees and so next year will need a clearer plan to look after these plants and improve the harvest.

- Friday October 21st School day at the orchard to recognise National Apple Day
- Saturday October 22nd marking National Apple Day, bring your apples to the orchard for mass apple pressing. Make your own juice to preserve, drink on the day or to make cider. In later years the apples will come from the orchard. This year you will need to bring your own, and a container for the juice.
- Look out for Wassailing on Saturday 7th January, this could include a traditional procession from Fort End.
- The Mummers will be keeping a tradition alive with another performance of this ancient play at the orchard in January.
- There is talk of a performance of 'A Mid-summer Night's Dream' or Thomas Hardy's 'The Woodlanders'.

Farewell to Tiggywinkles' Founder

Les Stocker, the founder of St Tiggywinkles Wildlife Hospital died aged 73 in late July. Since establishing the Haddenham-based charity which cares for sick and injured wild animals in 1978 with his wife Sue, Les Stocker dedicated his life to caring for wild animals, and his sudden passing was a shock to Haddenham residents and the wildlife community.

Les inspired other individuals and organisations to rise to the challenge of rehabilitating wildlife. In addition to working very long hours, he wrote books, papers and attended conferences to establish the importance and furtherance of rehabilitation. His tireless dedication has changed the way the world sees and deals with sick and injured wildlife.

Widely recognized as a leading authority on British wildlife, Les was awarded an MBE, was made Honorary Associate of the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons and Rolex Laureate and was an invited member of the New York Academy of Science.

Nearly three hundred mourners attended Les's funeral and memorial service on Tuesday 2nd August, led by the Rev Margot Hodson. He is survived by his wife Sue and son Colin who now manages the hospital and trust.

Another excellent brew – the 2016 Summerfest

The Haddenham Beer Festival Trust pulled off another amazing event on 2 July, when over 3700 ticket-buying guests and their children enjoyed a great day, despite the changeable weather.

The drinks – beer, lager, craft ales, and a Pimms bar - were complemented by a wide range of food and no less than fourteen live bands, and it was a splendid day for all the family.

The success of the festival relies heavily on over 100 sponsors and an army of 150 volunteers, working to set up and take down and help on the day.

The Summerfest enabled the Beer Festival Trust, a registered charity, to continue its magnificent contribution to good causes in the village and surrounding area. Since its inauguration, the Trust has been able to make grants totalling some £250,000 and hopes to increase that figure this year – the Winterfest takes place on Saturday 10 December!



Life Long Learning with Haddenham U3A

Haddenham U3A (University of the Third Age) is probably the largest organisation in the village with approximately 350 members. The U3A Movement was conceived in the early 1980s when it was recognised that people in their 'Third Age' (ie no longer in full time employment or raising a family) had a wealth of knowledge and experience which could be usefully shared with other 'Third Agers' to the benefit of all concerned. The idea of a movement comprising lots of local, selfgoverning U3As was born. The main purpose was to be educational in its widest sense, thus also embracing leisure pursuits and social activities. The movement quickly grew and by November this year there will be 1000 local U3As. More recent research has shown that keeping active mentally is just as important as physical activity. Learning new skills or keeping in touch with such activities such as Square Dancing, A Level French, gardening, local history, digital photography, opera, reading to name but a few. The motto of U3A is 'LEARN, LAUGH & LIVE!'

At the first meeting of Haddenham U3A in July 2001 there were 25 people. By May 2003 membership had grown to 115. So within two years it was firmly established and has continued to go from strength to strength. Each month there are two general meetings where there is a speaker followed by socialising over tea and biscuits. Recently we heard a retired customs officer talking about his 40 Years catching smugglers, a farmer talking all about the charity 'Send a Cow' and his self-milking cows and a talk on how both Amy Johnson and Leslie Howard 'failed to return'. There are over 30 interest groups ranging from cycling to wine tasting to German, so you can keep physically fit, mentally fit and have fun. There are regular outings each month to such places as Buckingham Palace, the Jewellery Quarter Museum in Birmingham and the RHS Garden at Wisley plus regular theatre visits. Earlier this year a group went to Provence to practise their French and in October a group will be visiting Northern Ireland.

Former Medical Centre Transformed into a boutique gym

As we go to press the opening of the new Fitlife Boutique Gym in the former medical centre building at Banks Park is scheduled in the coming days. The Parish Council, acting as the trustee of Banks Park Recreation Charity, started negotiations with the NHS back in 2013. The NHS had allowed the building to become dilapidated after failing to find a new tenant or carry out routine maintenance of the building following relocation to the new medical centre on Stanbridge Road. The leaking roof meant that the building required a major refurbishment to bring it back into use and we weren't sure that anyone would be willing to take on this challenge.

Fortunately, when the building was marketed, local fitness instructor Steven Gregory was looking to expand his successful boot camp business into a boutique gym. Steven saw the potential of the building and after a series of negotiations with the NHS and Parish Council the lease was reassigned and the building transferred to the ownership of Fitlife.

Work began in earnest to refurbish the building in early 2016 to create Steven's vision of a gym facility that will be the perfect balance between beauty and function. The quirky layout of the building has dictated a fit out with the finest equipment, custom built functional training areas, a physiotherapy clinic, glamorous changing and shower facilities and a luxury snack bar with tailored nutrition. 

Haddenham Educational Charity Grants






